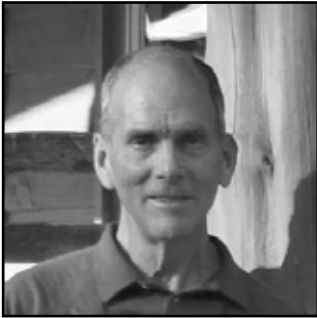

Town Annual Report Dedication

The 2009 Town of Fairlee Annual Report is dedicated to the memory of Robert Gregory (Greg) McGrath and William Chapman.

Robert Gregory McGrath passed away on August 21, 2009. Greg was a kind, intelligent and inquisitive man who devoted tireless efforts to the community with unwavering integrity. During his nine years as a resident, he



served for a period on the Town Budget Committee and volunteered on numerous Town projects. He was past-President of the Lake Morey Protective Association, served as a director of the Lake Morey Foundation and member of the Lake Morey Commission, led the Lake Morey View-shed Project and was an integral part of the lake's milfoil eradication program.

William Thomas Chapman passed away on October 20, 2009. The fourth child of Leland T. and Adele Peace Chapman, he was born at home in Fairlee on November 17, 1952. He attended school at the Fairlee Elementary School and graduated from Hanover High School in 1970. He graduated from Marlboro College in 1975 and Tulane Law School in 1982. In the early 1980s he had a small law practice in Fairlee. Will served on the Fairlee FAST Squad, the Fairlee Planning Commission from 1985-1988 and the Fairlee Selectboard from 1988-1991, where he was instrumental in reviving the 4th of July parade. Under Will's direction, the third generation to run the family business, Chapman's Pharmacy became Chapman's Store.

**ANNUAL TOWN MEETING
MARCH 3, 2009
MINUTES**

Town Meeting was held at the Samuel Morey Elementary School gymnasium on Tuesday, March 3, 2009. 116 voters registered at the door. Total number of voters on the voter checklist was 711.

The meeting was called to order at 10:05 am by Bruce A. Taylor, Moderator.

Bruce A. Taylor, Moderator turned the meeting over to Selectboard Member Frank J. Barrett, Jr. for the purpose of voting on Article 1.

Article 1. To elect a moderator.

Russell Smith nominated Bruce A. Taylor for Moderator for one year. The nomination was seconded by Larry Martin. There were no other nominations. Motion was made, seconded, and voted in the affirmative for the Clerk to cast one ballot for Bruce A. Taylor, Moderator for one year.

Bruce A. Taylor, Moderator asked Russell Smith to lead the flag salute. He then thanked Gary Collins, Rivendell's Director of Operations, for setting up the chairs and tables for town meeting. He also announced that the 5th graders would be selling refreshments during town meeting and that the donations from this bake sale would help fund their class trip to the Hulbert Outdoor Center. He also announced the 3rd grade class would be visiting to observe town meeting.

Bruce A. Taylor, Moderator, suspended the rules to allow Sarah Copeland-Hanzas, Fairlee's Representative to the Vermont State Legislature, to give a legislative update to those assembled. She circulated her Town Meeting Legislature Update flyer and made available Senator Doyle's Town Meeting Survey. She encouraged voters to give her their thoughts on issues they might have with state government and comments on what they feel is working well. She also pointed out that this year the legislature will have tough decisions to make on where to trim the 2010 state budget which is now projected to be \$90 million dollars short even after the stimulus money from the federal government.

Article 2. To hear and act upon the Town Officers' Reports.

Philip Zalinger was not present to comment. The question was called. Article 2 passed in the affirmative.

David Colby made the motion to accept Article 4. Dan Ludwig seconded the motion. There was no discussion. Article 4 passed in its entirety.

Article 5. Shall the voters of the Town of Fairlee authorize the Selectboard to accept and administer any Federal, State or private grant money?

Larry Martin made the motion to move Article 5. Clyde Blake seconded the motion. There was no discussion. Article 5 passed in the affirmative.

Meeting Minutes Cont'd

Article 6. To act upon the Recommendations of the Budget Committees as they pertain to Highway Expenses and to appropriate a sum of money for Highway expenses.

John Stewart questioned the highway contractual expenses. Stating that in 2005 these expenses were \$55,000 in 2006 they were \$60,000 but in 2008 the expenses jumped to \$118,000 and now in 2009 are up to \$122,000. He added that he didn't believe the town has any more roads then it used too. Frank J. Barrett, Jr. Selectboard Member agreed that the mileage of the town roads had not changed but expenses have gone up and the townspeople expectations have changed on how quickly roads should be cleared after a storm. He also added Timothy (Tim) Cramer has been a good addition to the Selectboard due to his vast background in highway matters. Cameron (Cami) Buster, Budget Committee Member added that the largest jump in the highway budget this year is grant expenses and special projects. Chris Gulick asked that the Selectboard bid out highway jobs. Frank J. Barrett, Jr., Selectboard Member replied that the Selectboard would be willing to review this request but will need to wait until the town's contract with Malcolm expires. James (Jim) Harris voiced his support for the Selectboard to bid out highway jobs. Blakeney Bartlett added that this should apply to all town jobs as well. After a few more questions regarding special projects dedicated for Quinibeck and Hebbard Road, Cameron (Cami) Buster, Budget Committee Member encouraged the voters to attend the public budget hearing where many questions can be answered and decisions on the budget are made. Russell Smith made a motion to move the question. The motion was seconded. The question was called. Article 6 passed in the affirmative.

Article 7. To raise such sum of money as may appear necessary for the Maintenance and Improvements of the Town Highways for the ensuing year, and to authorize collection of same by the Town Treasurer under 32 VSA 4791. Property taxes shall be billed on or before September 1, 2009 and shall be due and payable on or before October 1, 2009. Interest shall be at a rate allowed by law and shall be payable on all past due taxes.

Noël Walker, Listers asked for a point of order stating that a dollar amount had not been voted on in Article 6. Cameron (Cami) Buster, Budget Committee Member made the motion that the town appropriate the sum of

\$323,645 for highway expenses and the town raise the sum of \$158,392 by taxes for the maintenance and Improvements of the Town Highways. The motion was seconded. Leda Amanatidis questioned the \$70,000 bridges line item in the highway budget and questioned where bridges were located. Timothy (Tim) Cramer, Selectboard Member explained the bridge-culvert is located on Brushwood Rd right before the Aloha Foundation maintenance shop. After some explanation on how the bridge will be repaired, and concern from the voters that this was a large amount of money to spend on a class 4 road, Russell Smith asked for a point of order. He explained that this discussion should happen under Article 9. Bruce Taylor, Moderator acknowledged the point of order and ruled in favor that this discussion be under Article 9. The question was called. Article 7 passed in the affirmative.

Article 8. Shall the voters of the Town of Fairlee authorize the Selectboard to move funds within the Capital Budget originally designated as Highway Shed to Highway.

Robert (Greg) McGrath made the motion to move Article 8. Mary Daly seconded the motion. The article was open for discussion. David Colby asked for the amount of the funds in the Highway Shed line item. Melissa Gahagan, Treasurer informed the voters that the amount is \$25,000. Sandra Smith-Ordway questioned whether the town still needed the shed money. Frank J. Barrett, Jr., Selectboard Member explained that a few years ago the Selectboard had been told that the State of Vermont may one day require salt piles to be stored under a building. This Vermont League of Cities and Towns states that this is no longer the case. The Selectboard would like to transfer this money to a Highway Capital fund and use it for road infrastructure. The question was called. Article 8 passed in the affirmative.

Article 9. Shall the voters of the Town of Fairlee appropriate the following sums to undertake capital improvements within the Town in accordance with the Capital Budget and Program adopted by the Selectboard? A sum not to exceed:

- a) \$30,000 towards the resurfacing of Town Highways
(\$15,000 to be raised by taxes in 2009)

- b) \$70,000 towards Bridges
(\$4,000 to be raised by taxes in 2009)
- c) \$3,500 towards the Town Hall
(\$10,000 to be raised by taxes in 2009)
- d) \$4,535 towards Railroad Station
(\$4,535 to be raised by taxes in 2009)
- e) \$46,577 towards the Emergency Building
(\$16,577 to be raised by taxes in 2009)
- f) \$1,500 towards computers and server
(\$2,000 to be raised by taxes in 2009)

Robert (Greg) McGrath made the motion to move Article 9. Cameron (Cami) Buster, Budget Committee Member seconded the motion. Article 9 was open for discussion. Conversation on the funding of the bridge work continued. Lisa Hinsley clarified to the voters that all but \$4,000 of the \$70,000 allocated for the bridge work is funded by grant money. Timothy (Tim) Cramer, Selectboard Member added that the Selectboard will not do the repair work unless the town receives the grant. Barry Larson made the motion to amend Article 9 to include \$10,000 in the Capital Budget Fire Truck line item. After some discussion in support of this amendment the amendment was seconded. Bruce Taylor, Moderator called the question. The amendment passed in the affirmative. Melissa Madden asked for an explanation on the Capital Budget line items and how they are listed. Cameron (Cami) Buster, Budget Committee Member explained that the Capital Budget is like a savings account, amounts show proposed spending for 2009 and amounts to be raised by taxes to put towards saving. Cameron (Cami) Buster, Budget Committee Member made the motion to appropriate the sum of \$62,112 for the Capital Budget. The motion was seconded. The question was called. Article 9 passed in the affirmative.

Article 10. Shall the voters of the Town of Fairlee authorize an amount of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for the continued Restoration of the Fairlee Town Land Records? Said amount is included in the "Other" Budget.

Gerald (Butch) Colby made the motion to move Article 10. Cameron (Cami) Buster, Budget Committee Member seconded the motion. There was no discussion. Article 10 passed in the affirmative.

Meeting Minutes Cont'd

Article 11. To act upon the recommendations of the Budget Committee as they pertain to Town Expenditures and to appropriate a sum of money for Town Expenses.

Cameron (Cami) Buster, Budget Committee Member made the motion that the Town appropriate the sum of \$713,116 for Town Expenses. The motion was seconded. Article 11 was opened for discussion. Timothy (Tim) Price questioned the 3% increase in the town employee's salaries and the \$4,000 the Selectboard spent on legal fees. Frank J. Barrett, Jr. explained that when a suit is filed against the Town, the Town must hire an attorney. Lawrence (Larry) Gatto questioned why the budget for the Regional Planning Commission dues were moved to the Planning Commission Budget. Frank J. Barrett, Jr., Selectboard Member explained the Selectboard that felt this would allow the Planning Commission more input in the matter if it was in their budget. The question was called. Article 11 passed in the affirmative.

Article 12. To raise such sum of money as may appear necessary for Town Expenses and Indebtedness for the ensuing year and to authorize collection of same by the Town Treasurer under 32 VSA 4791. Property taxes shall be billed on or before September 1, 2009 and shall be due and payable on or before October 1, 2009. Interest shall be at a rate allowed by law and shall be payable on all past due taxes.

Cameron (Cami) Buster, Budget Committee Member made the motion for the Town to raise by taxes the sum of \$529,417 for Town Expenses and Indebtedness for the ensuing year and to authorize collection of same by the Town Treasurer under 32 VSA 4791. Property taxes shall be billed on or before September 1, 2009 and shall be due and payable on or before October 1, 2009. Interest shall be at a rate allowed by law and shall be payable on all past due taxes. The motion was seconded. There was no discussion. Article 12 passed in the affirmative.

Bruce Taylor, Moderator informed the voters that Article 13 should actually be Article 14 and if the voters had no objection he would read Article 14 first. There was no objection.

Article 14. Shall the voters of the Town Fairlee authorize the rental of the Railroad Station Green for the Flea Market?

Meeting Minutes Cont'd

David Penland spoke in support of authorizing the use of the Railroad Station green for the flea market. He added that it is good for the small local businesses because it brings people into town and it is a good social gathering place. Motion was made to move Article 14. The motion was seconded. The question was called. Article 14 passed in the affirmative.

Article 13. To transact any other proper Town business that may come before this meeting.

Dan Ludwig made the motion that the Selectboard seek council on whether it would be possible to have Timothy Price reimburse the town for legal expenses due to his law suit against the town. No further action was taken. Bruce Taylor, Moderator thanked all the volunteers and elected officials for their work for the town. Cameron (Cami) Buster introduced her two AFS students, Fabio Coelho, who is from Portugal and Sinan Baysan, who is from Turkey. Bruce Taylor, Moderator read the list of deceased for 2008 and asked for a moment of silence. Sandra Smith-Ordway thanked long time Treasurer Lisa Hinsley her years of service to the town and welcomed Melissa Gahagan as the new Treasurer, She also acknowledged both longtime and new people working for the Town and added that it was a real pleasure to come into the town offices and see happy people working there. The meeting ended with a round of applause. Russell Smith made the motion to adjourn. The motion was seconded.

FAIRLEE SELECTBOARD 2009 ANNUAL REPORT

The Selectboard believes it is important to acknowledge the tremendous amount of donated time given by a large number of people in many areas, much of which is behind the scenes and unrecognized. It is this sort of service that makes a town a great place to live. We would like to recognize all of these volunteers, many we know. Other services just mysteriously get done. We thank you all, on the front lines and behind the scenes for your great contributions to this town that make it a better place.

The town has once again been busy Saturday mornings with the Flea Market having a successful season, almost three times as many vendors as the previous year. Plans are for the Market to run the same in 2010.

We have great news about milfoil, or the lack of milfoil now. This has taken much time and money and has paid off. There are many people who went above and beyond investing in many ways and did a great service.

The Exhaust Evacuation system has been installed in the Emergency Building (a huge improvement for the health of all personnel) and vinyl flooring has been installed in the classroom and bedrooms. Also a new modine heater has been installed in the bay area, since parts to repair it are no longer available. As the building is nearing 20 years old, it is beginning to require some maintenance. Proposed are new vinyl flooring for the remainder of the living area, a roof installation over the north entry door and exterior wall repair on the north end. Our Fire Department and Rescue services do a fantastic service for the Town. We thank them all, and hope to be able to take care of their building a little bit each year as needs arise or to prevent needs from arising.

The Town Hall is in need of preventative maintenance as well, along with some energy saving updates. Painting the front side and some roof repair is hoped for. Also an energy audit has been completed coming up with several recommendations: programmable thermostats, insulation in the bulkhead and redesign of duct work among others. Our newly formed Energy Committee has been hard at work. Thank you all.

The Water Department and Highway Department are in basically good shape. We continue to have needs for maintenance. We do not want to fall behind, so our plan is to move forward with some projects each year.

Water rates have not increased since 2004, however there is a need for an increase in 2010. For the one family residences this will mean about \$4.50 more per quarter. Commercial rates will increase \$4.50-\$7.00 per quarter, depending on their classification. Seasonal camps/home will pay about \$4.00 more per quarter.

For the highway project on Quinibeck Road, our focus in the summer of 2009 was the Engineering Study, and we plan to continue the project in 2010. The Brushwood Bridge project went well, and came in under budget. Our past road crew has done a great job for 16 years but has now moved on. We thank them and welcome a new crew who we feel will be a good fit.

We have excellent employees in our town services and thank them for being so faithful to the town even in tough economic times. Our Administrative Department has had an especially trying year but has been strong and prevailed.

To all the committees that have tightened up budgets and taken good care of their commissions, thank you for a job well done.

We the Selectboard thank you for the opportunity to serve in a town that makes it a pleasure to serve. We hope we are being good stewards of this town you have asked us to oversee.

FAIRLEE BUDGET COMMITTEE 2009 ANNUAL REPORT

On January 4, 2010 the Budget Committee met with the Selectboard to review the proposed 2010 operational and capital budgets. The operational budget is the day to day expenses of the town while the capital budget sets aside funds for the purchase and improvement of the towns major assets. As these two budgets require different methods of planning, the Town of Fairlee has had a capital budget in place since 1999 to better prepare for projected major expenses. For this budget to stay fiscally sound, we encourage the Selectboard to continue to monitor and update current and future projects.

The Budget Committee had few questions of the Selectboard and department representatives this year as the Selectboard's request for level funding had been closely adhered to. A couple points presented included researching the Town of Fairlee's contributions to the Lake Fairlee Association for Milfoil control as it compares with West Fairlee and Thetford and in relation to our part of the lake whether measured through shoreline, grand list or population. These appropriations date back to at least 2002 and in that time have totaled over \$41,000. It was also requested that the Town contact Orford for a contribution to our increasing cost of the 4th Of July fireworks. This was done. However, Orford declined to assist with that this year but left the option open for future consideration.

Raises of 3% for this year were limited to the Board of Listers, Librarian and Beach Lifeguards. Certain other town employees will receive a 2009 Merit Award based on exemplary performance during the year and include the Town Clerk, Administrative Assistant, Treasurer and Chief of Police.

Two items for the capital budget will be to move the balance saved for a Police cruiser to Fire & Rescue as it is anticipated that in the future Fairlee will be contracting more with Orange County to provide law enforcement services to the town. It is also anticipated that a purchase of a new fire truck is not too far off. Funds are also being added to the Capital Budget in anticipation of Fairlee's 250th anniversary celebration in 2011.

The Selectboard approved the final budget on January 19, 2010. The estimated amount to be raised by taxes is \$629,952 with the estimated Total Tax Rate of 0.29 (29 cents) per \$100. This compares favorably with

last year's amount raised by taxes of \$634,767 and a Total Tax Rate that was also 0.29.

Since 1995 Cami Buster has been an active and knowledgeable member of this Committee and has announced that this will be her final year. It is with regret that the Town accepts her decision to step down but extends heartfelt gratitude for the time she has devoted to assisting the Town of Fairlee be a financially sound place to live, work and raise a family.

FAIRLEE TOWN CLERK 2009 ANNUAL REPORT

In 2009 the Town Clerk's Office recorded 1257 pages in the Land Records, 13 Marriage Licenses, 5 Death Certificates, 6 Burial Transit Permits/Cremation Certificates, processed 220 DMV Renewals, sold 33 Hunting and Fishing Licenses, 3 Passports, and 213 Dog Licenses. It was a busy year!

Since 1992 the Fairlee Voters have approved monies to be used for the restoration of the Fairlee Land Records. During these last seventeen years we have made great strides in accomplishing this. Most of our earlier Land Record Books and Vital Record Books have been restored. Only three early Land Record Books remain. This year I have made another request in the Town Warning to raise a \$1,000.00 under Article 11 to continue this restoration work. In 1996 the Legislature authorized the legislative body of municipalities to create a fund from Town Clerks recording fees to be used for the sole purpose of conservation, restoration, and preservation of municipal records. In July of 2009 recording fees were increased in hopes that towns would set aside these monies for the computerization of municipal records. In hopes of creating one fund that would cover restoration, preservation and computerization of municipal records I have included Articles 15 and 16 in the Town Warning. Your continued support to help me take care of the Fairlee records would be much appreciated.

Please remember to purchase your 2010 Dump/Beach passes. The Dump pass is \$5.00 and the Beach Pass is \$3.00. For your convenience Dump/Beach Passes can be purchased through the mail. Please contact the Town Clerk's Office to make arrangements.

The Rabies Clinic will be on Wednesday, March 17, 2010 from 6:30pm-7:30pm at the Fairlee Fire Station. Fairlee residents may also license their dogs at this time. The deadline to license dogs is April 1, 2010. Dog licenses may also be purchased through the mail.

In closing I would like to thank the residents and taxpayers of Fairlee, it has been a pleasure to serve you for another year. I would also like to thank my Assistant Town Clerks Shirley Godfrey and Sondra Farnham for all their hard work and support.

In the fall I was able to negotiate with our vendor a new copier contract for a better, newer and more user friendly copier – at the same rate we had been paying for a “lesser” model. The first week of January 2010, I moved the general fund checking account back to Merchants Bank from Mascoma Bank. In addition to earning a better interest rate we will also not be service charged.

When the Selectboard did away with the trash card program last winter and changed the way our trash is hauled at the transfer station a huge reduction was made to our 2010 trash budget: \$20,240.00 less than 2009’s. December 31, 2009 our trash expense was \$31,953.45 -- \$9,617.55 under budget.

Last May the Town’s books were audited by the Montpelier accounting firm of Pace and Hawley. The auditors/accountants found everything in order and made only a couple of suggestions for in-house record keeping. We came in under budget paying \$12,500.00 after budgeting \$15,000.00. Since the Town elects a Board of Auditors to review our books annually, the town has never budgeted for yearly audits – a huge savings to the Town as long as we continue to have a qualified and engaged Board of Auditors. In 2011 the Selectboard will begin putting \$5,000 a year into the Capital Budget in anticipation of the 2013 audit. (A professional audit should be done at least every 3-4 years.)

The Town will see additional savings to Town Hall expenses (fuel and electric) when all the suggested improvements made in last Fall’s energy audit are completed.

F Y I: As of December 31, 2009 there is \$46,981.51 in unpaid property taxes and \$6,732.13 in unpaid water accounts. This year I will send \$889,647 to Montpelier for school taxes. \$1,811,545 will go to the Rivendell District.

The SPAN number required for this form can be found on your 2009 Fairlee Property Tax Bill. The HS-122 Form is in the 2009 Vermont Income Tax Return Booklet or you can file on-line at <http://tax.vermont.gov>.

This year the real estate market in Fairlee has been relatively quiet. Throughout Vermont, the real estate market has been mixed with condos and second homes particularly in ski areas at the beginning of 2009 experiencing the greatest drop in market value. Generally speaking properties in Fairlee have maintained their values as reflected by Fairlee's Common Level of Appraisal (CLA) 100.95 for 2010.

The Reappraisal Grand List Fund annually receives \$9.50 per Grand List parcel. The balance as of December 31st, 2009 was \$10,850. The Listers Education Fund receives approximately \$389 annually for listers training. The balance in this fund was \$1,034.87.

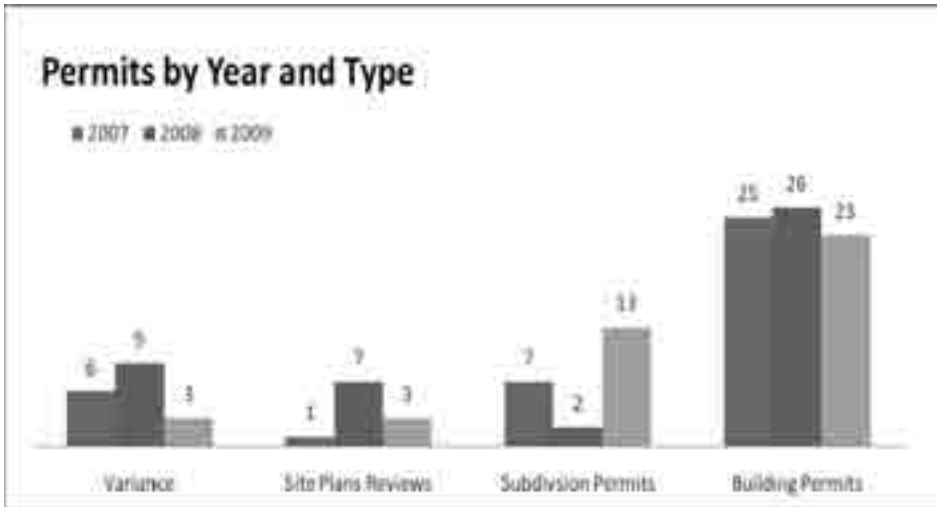

FAIRLEE DEVELOPMENT REVIEW BOARD 2009 ANNUAL REPORT

The Development Review Board is a quasi-judicial body appointed by the select board to evaluate and grant proposed subdivisions, interpret and apply Zoning Regulations and hear appeals from decisions of the Zoning Administrator.

Our goal is to guide developers and land owners through the development process keeping in mind the rights of landowners to develop their property as they wish, while maintaining a balance with the overall growth, development and public health and safety interests of the Town. Our intent is to treat all landowners equally, to conduct fair and open hearings, and to base our decisions on the facts presented to us; relying upon relevant Town ordinances and State statutes, and guided by common sense.

2009 was a year of transition for the Development Review Board.

Following the resignations of long-time board member Phil Zalinger, the Select board appointed Peter Berger and Anthony Gahagan to the board. In August, both our Clerk and Zoning Administrator resigned.

One of the first tasks undertaken by the new board was the development of a mission statement and a major revision of the Board's Procedural Rules and Ethics Policies manual. Both of these documents can be found in the DRB section of the Town's website www.FairleeVT.org. We also post important DRB and Zoning documents on the website. These documents include upcoming meeting agenda, past meeting minutes, Zoning and Subdivision Regulations and application forms for permits, subdivisions and waivers. We have averaged 125 Website visits per week recent months.

Perhaps the most significant application before the DRB in 2009 was the re-hearing of the Colby Block redevelopment project. Despite having received all required approvals for a combined commercial/residential project in 2008, the developer came before the DRB in (month) with scaled back plans due to changed economic conditions. Following a well attended public hearing, the developer withdrew his application. The property was later sold to a New Hampshire corporation which cleaned up the lot and has no immediate plans for development.

The DRB also formed joint working committees with members of the Planning Commission to work on updating the Town's zoning regulations. The State requires all towns to bring their zoning and subdivision regulations into alignment with their most recent Town Plans. In addition, the DRB wanted the updated regs to eliminate many unworkable or unclear provisions of the 1973 Zoning Regulations. This work is ongoing and flows from the new Town Plan which was approved by Fairlee's voters.

The DRB also worked closely with the Select board and Zoning Administrators to develop and formalize policies and procedures which will encourage compliance with the Town's Zoning Regulations and with conditions imposed upon granted permits. The DRB believes that effective zoning is based upon voluntary compliance by all landowners. The DRB also worked with the Select board, Planning Commission and Two Rivers Regional Planning Commission to implement interim zoning regulations while the Town develops and votes on permanent regulations.

During 2009, the DRB reviewed 13 subdivision applications; conducted 3 site plan reviews; considered 3 conditional use permits.

The DRB will continue to refine its procedures and practices in the coming years as the Town continues to grow and the need to effectively balance the rights of landowners with the land use and development values expressed by the Town and State increase.

In 2009 I responded to over 416 calls and investigated 42 animal complaints. I ran radar and Lidar, a laser speed measuring device, with High Visibility vehicular and foot patrols and checked property on a regular basis.

The three tier system (state, county and local) is working well - Providing good law enforcement results at a very reasonable cost.

LAKE MOREY COMMISSION 2009 ANNUAL REPORT

On June 10, 2009, Aquatic Control Technology (ACT) applied six tons of Renovate OTF (flake) along the 52 acre shoreline in the southwestern, southern, and eastern portions of Lake Morey at a concentration rate of 2.25 parts per million. This application was 22 percent stronger and one month later than that of 2008. During the post-treatment survey in July, no milfoil plants were observed in the treated areas.

Supplementing this activity was the hiring of the Aquatic Endeavors (AE) dive team employed in 2008. They spent eight days suction harvesting the five mini-beds in the western section of the lake and seven days hand harvesting the scattered plants there and in the northern area.

Also, adopt-a-lake volunteers reported almost 1200 hours of observing and pulling plants and others, along with off-duty State Troopers, worked at the access to greet fishermen to discuss the milfoil situation and review the regulations that prohibit transporting the plant.

In light of the facts that a 100 percent kill rate was achieved in the areas targeted for chemical treatment, the five mini-beds were effectively addressed by suction harvesting, native pond weeds continue to flourish, the fish population was not adversely affected, and all were accomplished at \$19,000 under budget indicates that this was a very successful anti-milfoil year for Lake Morey.

After the ACT survey in August, it was decided that in 2010 a chemical treatment was not necessary, the AE dive team would again be engaged for hand and suction harvesting, and the adopt-a-lake volunteers would be asked to increase their efforts by at least 50 percent to look for and remove the scattered milfoil plants that are destined to return,

LAKE FAIRLEE ASSOCIATION 2009 ANNUAL REPORT

This Year

In 2009 the Lake Fairlee Association continued its milfoil control program, employing a team of divers to hand pull and suction harvest milfoil, and to deploy plastic bottom barriers to kill it. The length of our dive season was reduced by about 10% from previous years, due to a decline in funding from the State of Vermont and from local donors

The Future

Lake Fairlee's milfoil problem is growing. In spite of our efforts, this year the milfoil grew robustly farther around the lake than ever before. In response, last summer the Association invited two companies that specialize in waterbody management to survey the lake and make recommendations. Both confirmed our fears, and suggested that the application of a herbicide could eradicate the majority of the milfoil and allow us to regain control of the lake.

We hired one of these companies, Lycott Environmental, to do a scientific survey of the aquatic vegetation. This survey is a necessary first step towards an herbicide permit application, and confirmed that milfoil has spread over more than 25% of the lake by area. We invited scientists from the State Department of Environmental Conservation, and representatives from nearby Lake Morey, where they have had a successful experience treating milfoil with chemicals. We learned about the relative safety of the process and of the herbicide *triclopyr* itself. Nobody wants to put chemicals in the lake, but if we do not, the lake will likely become increasingly overtaken by the plant until it is unusable.

The Lake Fairlee Association Board decided to work with Lycott to develop a five-year management plan and apply for a permit to use an herbicide next June. The good news is that the overall cost of our milfoil program will not increase, and should actually decrease beginning in 2011. Support On behalf of all those who use and enjoy Lake Fairlee, we would like to thank you for your generous contribution of \$5000 in 2009. In 2010 the need is even greater. If we are permitted to use the herbicide, we hope to reduce the milfoil in the lake greatly. If not, we will use our traditional means. In either case we again require your support. We are asking for \$5000, which is about 5% of our total budget.

LAKE MOREY FOUNDATION 2009 ANNUAL REPORT

The Lake Morey Foundation was created 25 years ago to encourage and expand upon the efforts of the Lake Morey Protective Association, Lake Morey Commission, and federal, State and Town agencies aimed at protecting, preserving and enhancing the environment of Lake Morey. The Foundation operates under Section 501(c)(3) of the federal tax code, so private contributions to it are exempt from federal income tax.

In 2009 as in other recent years the Foundation addressed its primary attention to providing the private funding required to support the milfoil control program in Lake Morey, details of which can be found elsewhere in this 2009 Town Report. As always we continue to stay alert to other potential environmental threats as well, in the fighting of which the Lake Morey Foundation might be able to make a key difference by stepping in early and generously. Also, we remain interested in and stand ready to support initiatives aimed at preserving our cherished viewshed and watershed in the face of ever increasing developmental pressures in the Lake Morey region.

For all these reasons we continue to seek to build up our financial reserves through regular annual tax exempt contributions from our loyal supporters so we'll be ready when called upon. To all who have contributed to the Lake Morey Foundation once or a dozen or more times in the past, we hope to hear from you again. And to those who haven't yet, this would be a great time to start! Thank you!

RIVENDELL TRAIL ASSOCIATION 2009 ANNUAL REPORT

- Our Trail map is done and selling well. Andy Boyce, our cartographer and trail Coordinator, did a fabulous job of designing this map and getting it out to stores. Chapman's Store in Fairlee and Crossroad Farm in Post Mills have been our big outlets.

- Sally Tomlinson had to step down from the Board, after 8 straight years. To show our appreciation on National Trails Day, June 6th, we hosted Sally Tomlinson Appreciation Day. With permission from our Orford friends, the Tses, 15 of us built a new ½ mile section running along the edge of the Jacobs Brook glacial delta and passing near to Tillotsen Falls. Others hiked the Sunday Mountain trail section. It was a fine day for Trails!

- We wrote and won a N.H. Recreational Trails Grant for \$13,000 which allowed Rivendell to run a two week trail crew on Mt.Cube. Val Stori returned to be our summer program director. The Cube trail has been pounded with use. Val's crew, particularly Travis Streeter, a 10th grader and assistant leader, hauled a huge pile of hemlock boards up the mountain to make bog bridges in the "birch grove" and did a terrific amount of ditching and waterbars.

- The Mountain School in Vershire celebrated its 25th year this year. They have been landowner hosts of the trail since the early years and use the trail extensively for their programs. They decided to celebrate their 25 years by partnering with us to host the 5th Annual Ramble. Students and community members, in the rain – some 13 miles, some 6 miles, some 3 – hiked a total of over 500 miles. We followed this with a great dinner at the school and some fine dancing with Jeannie and the High Tops.

- Most importantly, Andy Boyce worked tirelessly to help teachers use the trail in their work, and the number and breadth of trails connections has been impressive. The trail is now truly a part of school tradition, particularly at Westshire where the entire school hiked the Bald Top Section. Some Westshire students have now hiked 27 miles of the trail. The Middle School hiked Sunday Mountain. We are known as "the schools with the trail" and are very proud of it!

The RTA provides funds for the Coordinator position, trail insurance, volunteer coordination and recognition, equipment and more. The Ramble, memberships, contributions from the four towns of Rivendell, and generous corporate sponsorship provide much of our support! - Article 11.** Shall the voters of the Town of Fairlee authorize an amount of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for the continued Restoration of the Fairlee Town Land Records? Said amount is included in the "Other" Budget.
- Article 12.** To act upon the recommendations of the Budget Committee as they pertain to Town Expenditures and to appropriate a sum of money for Town Expenses.

- Article 17.** Shall the voters of the Town of Fairlee allow the Recreation Council to offer non-resident swim lesson participants and their immediate families to purchase a beach pass for the two week duration of their swim lesson?
- Article 18.** To transact any other proper Town business that may come before this meeting.
